Our Cruising plans for 2021 include:

May 7-9th: The Annual shakedown cruise in Anacortes* – Captain TBD

This annual event location provides a great venue for the cruisers with Anthony's restaurant just up the hill. They have a party barge with BBQs and tables already for OHYC's visit. There is also RV parking for the Land Cruisers a short walk away from Dock "C" where the fun and camaraderie is happening.

May 28 – 31st: Memorial Day Deer Harbor Cruise / Ocras Island* – Captain Pete Hillberry

Pete's Memorial weekend cruise has the best BBQ food of any cruise. There is also a hotel next door to the marina for the Land Cruisers; for more information visit Deer Harbor (www.vacasa.com/usa/Deer-Harbor-Inn-WA)

On Saturday local farms and orchards bring their goods to the wonderful Farmer's Market in Eastsound. On Saturday there is also the annual "Pet Parade" where locals and visitors have a fun time watching the menagerie of animals, including farm critters parade through the streets ending at the Eastsound Farmer's Market

Orcas Island's homegrown population of artisans and craftsmen ensure a continuous selection of unique local products. Stores at the Orcas Village and in Eastsound sell locally made goods including jewelry, clothing, and artwork.

June 4 – 6 th: Fisherman's Bay / Lopez Island– Captain TBD

Fisherman's Bay is a great follow-on venue for cruisers as the Memorial Day cruise is not over until Monday. Cruisers typically visit some of the other locations like Roche or Friday Harbor for three or four days, then off to Fisherman's Bay. Another option is to use one of our reciprocal locations like the Orcus Island Yacht Club in the next bay to the east and stay for free.

July 9 – 11th: Port Townsend – Captain TBD

We will be staying at Point Hudson Marina and RV Park which is located just beyond the end of Water Street at the northeast corner of Port Townsend's commercial district, and home to the Northwest Maritime Center.

August 20 – 22th: Kingston – Captain TBD

We will be staying at The Port of Kingston Marina. From the Marina we are just a short walk to the Kingston/Edmond's Ferry and a hop-step-and-jump to local downtown fun-fare, which includes spectacular food, drink, and specialty shops. This trip is highlighted by eating at Sourdough Willy's Pizzeria, where the sourdough dates back to the Alaskan gold rush and is the oldest in commercial use in the Pacific Northwest and one of the oldest being used for pizza in the United States. Another great place is J'amie Les Crepes. The crepes are mouthwatering and they serve both savory and sweet crepes.

On Saturday we can take the Ferry to Edmonds. On weekends Main Street in Edmonds is closed to allow pedestrian traffic to fill the street, giving shoppers more elbow room, and restaurants room for dining outdoors. There is a wonderful Farmer's Market and numerous galleries and distilleries and eateries that earned Edmonds the distinction of being the state's first recognized Cultural District.

September 24 – 26th: Roche Harbor / San Juan Island – Captain TBD

We will be staying at The Roche Harbor Resort Marina. Roche Harbor is a historic seaside resort located on San Juan Island. Steeped in rich history and surrounded by lush gardens, the village is a short drive from nearby Friday Harbor. For Land Cruisers the resort offers a wide variety of lodging options; luxurious modern homes, historic hotel and quaint cottages. This is the perfect time to visit Roche Harbor Resort, as the summer season has ended, the lower fall rates are in affect and the summer crowds are gone. Roche Harbor has the only heated pool on San Juan Island! Complete with splash pool for the little ones and plenty of lounge chairs to relax. The pool's gorgeous location gives you a bit of peace and quiet while still being able to watch the all of the activity going on in the harbor. A little treasure and short walk from the marina is a 19-acre outdoor sculpture park, home to more than 120 unique sculptures by Northwest artists.

Few memories of a Roche Harbor visit last longer than the first time you see the colors ceremony, a tradition since 1957. Just before sunset each night, they retire the flags of Roche Harbor, Washington state, Great Britain, Canada and the United States. The dock staff lower the flags while a song plays, and before the American flag comes down a cannon shot booms through the harbor.
