The following article about the origins of Race Week was authored by our late friend and longtime Club member, Stan Stanley. Now, 30 years later and following our first Whidbey Island Classic Regatta, it seems appropriate to reprint the article in his honor.

From the Vice Commodore;

This is a newsletter that ran in 1991 and written by Stan Stanley one of our great past Commodores. I wanted to share with all of you new and older members some of our past and the commitment that OHYC has always put into Race Week. It's you that make it great.

Whidbey Island Race Week Oak Harbor Yacht Club History and Tradition

By Stan Stanley Written in 1991

The Start:

Whidbey Island Race Week actually started in January 1982 at the Seattle

Boat Show with a meeting of the assistant Publisher of Yachting Magazine, Roger Leonhardi, then Harbormaster, the Seattle Yacht Club, and myself. Yachting wanted to do a West Coast weeklong regatta like they had done at Block Island in Long Island Sound. Seattle YC had recommended Oak Harbor as an excellent site. After a visit by Yachting in January, a July meeting was set with Yachting's Publisher for final approval. Remember, at this time OHYC was meeting in the Odd Fellows Hall and the clubhouse was in the discussion stage. At the July meeting with Commodore Curt Bland, Oak Harbor city fathers, Chamber of Commerce, and Seattle YC a July 1983 date was set for the first Whidbey Island Race Week.

The Early Days:

It was a race to get the Club House ready for the first race week. The temporary occupancy permit was issued on Saturday morning of Race Week (some say with the intervention of the mayor). The first Whidbey Island Race Week had 78 race boats and it rained all week. The site was still a construction site and we kept dumping chips and gravel over the mud. Seattle YC ran the races and OHYC started their tradition of outstanding hospitality.

Memories:

The British Airways Stewardesses in their spike heels in the mud, Pusser's Rum Punch, volleyball in sailing boots, and I still get emotional at the memory of 78 major race boats going out to the first race at OUR CLUB. The event was such a success that Yachting made a commitment on the spot to return for a 1984 Whidbey Island race Week.



The Yachting Years:

From 1983 until 1993 Yachting Magazine produced Whidbey Island Race Week. OHYC was the Host and Seattle YC conducted the races. During this time the event grew to a maximum of 175 boats in 1990 (we then limited the fleet to 150 boats). Whidbey Island Race Week was selected in 1986 by Yacht Racing and Cruising (now Sailing World) as one of the top 20 Mega Regattas in the world and again in 1987 as one of the top 10 regattas in the US. Additions included Reggae Night, the big tent, more sponsors, rock and roll, and more. The OHYC hosting and hospitality became as refined and professional as any top national event. The volunteer OHYC Chairpersons during this period were: myself 1983-1987, Curt Bland 1988- 1990, and Northwest Marine Productions: In April 1994 Yachting called and said that they had been told by their new owners to "stop throwing those race week parties and start making money as a magazine." After much scrambling, Bob Ross, the J-Boat dealer and long time participant, Paige and I realized that there was no way to put on a fullblown Race Week in the short time. We had plenty of input from the racers that they REALLY would continue to support the event. So, we decided to have a reduced one-design regatta to keep Race Week alive until we could see if a full race week was feasible without Yachting. With Crows Nest as the sponsor we held the 1994 Grow's Nest Oak Harbor International One Design Regatta with forty-two boats. Everything went off without a hitch. In fact, it was such a success that Crows Nest agreed to be the title sponsor for the 1995 Whidbey Island Race Week. Stan, Bob and Paige formed Northwest Marine Productions and with Yachting's help, Whidbey Island Race Week was back on track. None of us really knew what we were taking on. We had all coordinated events but none as large as Race Week. The tasks of coordinating sponsors, VIP boats, sailors, registration, bands, race committee, yacht clubs, protest committees, security, tents, marina space, ratings, phones, electricity, volley ball, golf, trophies, bartenders, sound system, porta-potties, Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, Daily Newspaper, posters, race program, sponsor packages, skipper bags, wrist bands, registration, public relations, press reporters, TV reporters, advertising, coordinating with the Navy for tent and trailer sites and our employees from the gophers to the newspaper editor and writers, we were learning as we went through the first years. We established a virtual organization: Bob as public relations and race organization; Stan as site management, Oak Harbor Yacht Club liaison, and sponsor coordination; Paige as business manager and entry management (she keeps Bob and Stan from going broke!). Yes it's true that when we had our first corporate meeting Stan and Bob flipped a coin for the election of officers; Bob lost and is still President. Our objective was first not to loose money, then; if possible, generate a return for our effort. So far we haven't lost but we surely don't want to count our hourly rate on our return. Contrary to rumor, this is not a living wage job.

Support:

In accomplishing all the above, in addition to OHYC, I need to recognize the outstanding support given to Race Week over the years by the Oak Harbor Marina; Dave Williams and all of his staff: the Oak Harbor Chamber of Commerce, whose staff fields all the calls about where to eat, sleep, shop and how to get here and Corinthian Yacht Club Race Committee who does a world class job of running races. As an OHYC member as well as with Northwest Marine Productions, I can't tell you just how proud I am of Oak Harbor Yacht Club and the volunteer contributions you have made to Whidbey Island Race Week. As far as I am concerned, YOU are the main reason for



the success of Race Week. Yachting used to be amazed at your hospitality and coordination and we continue to be impressed. In addition to our sponsors and the racers, Northwest Marine Productions considers OHYC an integral and necessary participant in Race Week. Without you there wouldn't be a Whidbey Island Race Week.

We hope that we can show our appreciation by producing an event where you can have as much FUN as the work you put in. This has been my objective in discussion with all of the volunteer coordinators, who I would like to personally thank: Patti McKinnon, Chris Christie, Ardy Fragola, and Sally Jacobs. I would be remiss if I didn't also thank Linda and the OHYC Staff for all the assistance and support they have provided over the years.

Finally my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to ALL the Oak Harbor Yacht Club Volunteers past, present and future.




